

**MINUTES
REGULAR MEETING OF
SHERIDAN CITY COUNCIL

June 8, 2020**

1. Call to Order

Mayor Beiter-Fluhr called the regular meeting of the Sheridan City Council to order at 7:06 p.m.

3. Invocation – Council Member Daigle gave the invocation.

4. Pledge of Allegiance – Mayor Beiter-Fluhr led the Pledge of Allegiance.

7. Staff Reports

- a. City Clerk – Reported two liquor licensees had applied and were approved for modifications to allow additional seating in their parking lots.

1) Ordinance No. 2-2020

COUNCIL MEMBER HALL MOVED TO APPROVE ORDINANCE NO. 2-2020, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHERIDAN COLORADO REPEALING AND REENACTING ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 70 OF THE SHERIDAN MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING STORMWATER QUALITY. Seconded by Council Member Mooney and approved unanimously.

1) Ordinance No. 3-2020

COUNCIL MEMBER CAMACHO MOVED TO APPROVE ORDINANCE NO. 3-2020, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHERIDAN, COLORADO, REPEALING AND REENACTING IN ITS ENTIRETY ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 38 OF THE SHERIDAN MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING ADOPTION OF THE 2020 MODEL TRAFFIC CODE FOR COLORADO. Seconded by Council Member Daigle and approved unanimously.

2) Ordinance No. 4-2020

COUNCIL MEMBER DAIGLE MOVED TO APPROVE ORDINANCE NO. 4-2020, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHERIDAN, COLORADO, DELETING IN ITS ENTIRETY SECTION 50-55, OPEN MARIJUANA CONTAINER – MOTOR VEHICLE PROHIBITED FROM THE SHERIDAN MUNICIPAL CODE. Seconded by Council Member Camacho and approved unanimously.

c. Resolutions

1) Resolution No. 10-2020

COUNCIL MEMBER BLACK MOVED TO APPROVE RESOLUTION NO. 10-2020, A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHERIDAN, COLORADO, APPROVING THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF

SHERIDAN AND ARAPAHOE COUNTY FOR SHARED USE OF ARAPAHOE COUNTY'S RADIO COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK. Seconded by Council Member Smith and approved unanimously.

2) Resolution No. 11-2020

COUNCIL MEMBER DAIGLE MOVED TO APPROVE RESOLUTION NO. 11-2020, A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHERIDAN, COLORADO, APPROVING THE SAFE STOPS THROUGH SHERIDAN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SHERIDAN AND THE STATE OF COLORADO. Seconded by Council Member Mooney and approved unanimously.

Mayor Beiter-Fluhr said Friday would see the on-line launch of this year's Sheridan Idol Competition. Sheridan Celebrates Charity Partner this year will be the Sharing with Sheridan Food Pantry.

13. Council Member's Choice

Council Member Smith expressed his concern that his neighbor's house had been put up for sale prior to all the renovations being complete.

Council Member Mooney expressed her frustration with Sheridan Sanitation District's short notice when repairing the sewer line on her street. She thanked staff for distributing the Sheridan Police Department's policy on Use of Force.
